## Let's talk Goals!

What are your goals for 2024? Are you in a regional area/facility? General practice/Urgent care? What skills do you need to provide more holistic care to your patients and community?

We have seen the introduction of urgent care centres around the country over the past year or so. The primary goal of these facilities is to take the pressure of emergency departments and presentations such manage as uncomplicated fractures. wounds and lacerations definitively; not referring onto an ED which defeats the initial purpose of an urgent care centre in the first place.

The transition from general practice primary care to urgent care is not always a simple one. For many doctors and nurses they are all of a sudden faced with higher level of trauma than they have seen for many years possibly since working in a tertiary facility. The reality of having sicker, more unstable patients present is much higher than in general practice.

As a emergency nurse and educator of over 35 years and having managed an ED for over 14 years; having a highly trained and skilled workforce is essential to safe timely and proficient care.



What are the essential clinical practice skills required to work safely in these facilities?

- Life support BLS, ALS, APLS
- Triage
- Recognising and responding to clinical deterioration
- Patient assessment
- Rhythm recognition and ECG interpretation
- IV cannulation/blood collection
- Point of care testing
- Trauma management:
- Fracture management splinting and casting.
- Suturing wound closure techniques
- Wound care


